First Meeting of 'College Development Committee (CDC)' for the Academic Year 2019 – 20
was held on **Wednesday, 28th August 2019 at 11:30 AM** in the Conference Hall.

Principal, Dr. A.M. Fulambarkar welcomed Hon'ble Chairman and all Members present for the **First** College Development Committee Meeting of Academic Year 2019 – 20. Leave of absence was granted to – Dr. S.N. Sapali, Nominee from Academia.

Meeting started with permission of the Chair. Following points were discussed as per the Agenda –

- 1) To read and confirm **Minutes** of the last Meeting held on **18/03/2019**.

It was informed that the observations and suggestions of the Experts Committee for NBA Accreditation for third Cycle are addressed. Minutes were read and confirmed.

2) To read and confirm **Action Taken Report** of the last Meeting.

Regarding applying for NBA Accreditation for UG Civil Engineering, PG Mechanical Design Engineering and Information Technology it was informed that –

- In view of PG in Construction Management under Civil Engineering, appointment of one Ph.D. Faculty is required to be made.
- PG Mechanical Design Engineering is eligible to apply and application would be submitted accordingly.
- For Information Technology, we shall be eligible to apply in Academic Year 2020 – 21

Regarding applying for **closure of MBA Program** it was informed that application is submitted to SPPU, would be submitted to AICTE and DTE as per the schedule.

This was discussed and approved.

3) To review **Expenses** from **March 2019, April 2019 to July 2019.**

- Salary is maintained at 68% as discussed earlier.
- Furniture Expenses appear on the higher side in view of various Laboratories developed in Academic Year 2017 – 18.
- Electricity Expenses appear on the higher side due to change in the Government rules which are reframed and hence these expensed would come down accordingly.
- Expenses towards Campus beautification are higher due to various changes carried out for applying for 'Clean Campus Award'

In view of good Admissions scenario and the increase in Intake in Computer Engineering (60 Students), Information Technology (60 Students) and PG Construction Management (18 Students) Fees Receipt has increased and hence **Revised Budget** is put up for consideration. This includes –

- Provision for Salary maintained at 68% with current DA.
- Equipment Expenses are considered as Rs. 1, 95, 00, 000/- including cost of Virtualization project Rs. 1 crore.
- International participation of Students in important Events like SAE and other Student Development initiatives
- Receipt includes Tuition Fess of Students and Revenue generation of Rs. 50 Lacs by all Departments.

Regarding Revenue generation, HODs are requested to review their Departments targets and intensify related efforts to achieve the same.

Information was shared regarding the **Reserve Fund of Rupees Twenty Five Lacs** created in the beginning of the Year (to be renewed after every three years).

4) To take review **Results of University Examination held in May / June 2019.**

FE – Out of 504 Students 450 Students have passed with distinction, one Student has passed with 10 SGPA, 248 Students have 9 and above SGPA, only 3 Students have passed in Second Class.

Special mention of six Students from Computer Engineering who have scored 100/100 marks in Mathematics was made.

About BE Results it was mentioned that most of the Students have passed in First Class and Distinction. It is observed as a trend that Quality and All Clear Results are same and marginal improvement is observed over the last three years.

Information was shared regarding **SPPU Rank holders** – total seven Students one from E & TC, three from Civil Engineering and three from Information Technology have made it to the SPPU Merit List. This is the last batch (2015) with Results in percentage, now onwards the Results would be as per Credit System.

Finally it was mentioned that Academics is our core strength and currently we are among the top three Institutes in Pune under SPPU. Further enhanced and diligent efforts are being invested to march ahead.

Research and innovation –

Revision of Policies – additional detailed discussions are requested and then the Policies can be recommended for consideration in the next Meeting.

Information was shared regarding various initiatives including Atal Incubation Centre, MoU with Pinnacle, MoU with Nayan Electronics for Robotics and Automation, Proposals submitted to DST and NRDC, various grants received, Publications and Copyrights, achievements in 'Avishkar' (one Student and two Faculty Members received Awards), MHRD Innovation Cell, SPPU Innovation Cell, idea generation Competitions, Project Competitions including Techlligent, Spectrum, MSME approaching PCCoE under Industry 4.0 initiatives etc.

It was suggested that Students can be involved in all such activities right from SE onwards so that proper desired inputs can be timely shared to achieve the expected outcomes.

Information was also shared regarding the recent MoU with PCMC under the Smart City Project and organization of a mini Hack-a-thon in Sept 2019 wherein all Colleges in PCMC area are invited to present their ideas. Genuine shortlisted ideas would be provided with incubation facilities in the Autocluster.

Mr. Abhijat Vichare suggested that various other dimensions of providing incubation facilities should also be considered which include Business Models, Prototypes, pre incubation, Marketing, Mentor system, support till registration of a Private Limited Company, Venture Capitalists etc.

An appeal was made to all Deans and HODs to guide their respective Teams to invest further focused and enhanced efforts to help all these aspects materialize as per expectations.

Placements –

Information was shared regarding the very encouraging scenario since the commencement. Following details were shared –

- Out of total eligible Students 80% Students (610 out of 700) are placed.
- 17 Companies visited, 430 Students placed
- 207 Students in Capgemini (6.8 Lacs), 59 Students in KPIT, 46 Students in Persistent, 27 Students in Quantify (10 Lacs), 170 Students with package above 5 Lacs, average package 4.5 Lacs

It was mentioned that to stand out in the very competitive and dynamic scenario of Industries today, our Students must be equipped with Programming Skills, Project based learning, Foreign Languages (Japanese, German) and English Communication Skills.

It was shared that learning Foreign Languages proves to be an advantage for Students, especially Japanese considering the demographic distribution and ample job opportunities in a country like Japan. It is a need of the hour and related efforts should be invested accordingly.

Students Development and Welfare –

- Information was shared regarding **ISR and NSS initiatives for Sangli and Kolhapur Flood Relief**, collection of twenty two utility items for the flood affected people and donation of Rupees Five lacs by 'PCET Family' given to 'Sakal Relief Fund'.
- Information was also shared regarding various Charity initiatives carried out by 'Team PCCoE' which includes provision of free meals, books, Uniforms etc every year for needy Students belonging to genuinely modest background.

This year 40 Students have applied for free meals and the expenses involved are around Rs. Ten Lacs. An appeal is made to all Faculty and Staff Members to contribute towards this noble cause.

PCET is also requested to contribute as part of Institute Social Responsibility to 'Students Welfare Fund' to support such initiatives.

5) To take review of the Admissions for the Academic Year 2019 – 20.

It was informed that Admissions scenario is very good (22 Seats vacant, date extended till 31 Aug 2019) with further enhanced cutoff (97 and above) for all Programs and we are at top third position in Pune under SPPU. DSE and MCA Admission also are full. MBA Admissions would be carried out as the directive for the same.

A special mention was made by Mr. Abhijat Vichare about PCCoE Students. He being a Member on various National Level Selection Committees mentioned that PCCoE Students genuinely stand apart with commendable involvement and positive attitudes.

It was also suggested that by providing Bus facility from prominent routes in Pune to PCCoE would definitely attract quality Students to join PCCoE. Additionally if we can provide Hostel facility to more number of Students (in and around the Campus) that would definitely help in attracting quality Admissions. Provision of Hostel would also result in overall best achievements of the Students as they save a lot of time and energy which is otherwise wasted in daily travel.

Information was shared regarding the re appointments (57 Teaching and 45 non Teaching) and new appointments (9 Teaching and 4 non Teaching) made.

7) Any other point with permission of the Chairman.

- Information was shared regarding the visit of **UGC Experts Committee for on-the-spot inspection for grant of fresh Autonomous status which is confirmed on 6th and 7th Sept 2019**. Invitation was extended to all Members to join the Opening Meeting on 6th Sept 2019.

It was shared that after receiving positive results we would be able to practice Autonomy from Academic Year 2020 – 21 and all related preparations are already in place as per expectations and guidelines.

Proposed efforts include provision of core Subjects, Electives, Projects, Internships, Audit Courses, Salient features, identifying weak learners and remedial efforts, Examinations and Evaluation, diligently planned efforts in the four important Domains – Academic Excellence, Innovation and Research, Professional Competence and Social Commitment, Programs for Skill Development, Professional development, Vocational Courses etc.

Proper thought is required to be given to Curriculum design, time requirement for the same, delivery and assessment. Only this would help us to provide a practically viable pattern.
