Deans, HODs and other Portfolio Members were invited to join this Meeting as 'Special Invitees'.

Principal, Dr. A.M. Fulambarkar welcomed Hon'ble Chairman and all Members present for the College Development Committee Meeting of Academic Year 2018 – 19. Meeting started with permission of the Chair.

Following points were discussed as per the Agenda –

**1) To read and confirm the Minutes of the last Meeting held on 24/03/2018.**

Minutes of the last Meeting were read and confirmed.

## 2) To read and confirm the Action Taken Report of the last Meeting.

Action Taken Report was discussed and following points were mentioned –

- **Indigenous development of ERP System for PCET** – Information was shared regarding the existing ERP System, various ongoing issues and lack of satisfactory support from M/S. Cloud Vision Systems Ltd. and reviews taken for proposed indigenous development.

Approximate estimated cost for the proposed indigenous development of ERP System for PCET is Rs. 18 Lacs per Annum including the appointment of related Developers and their Salary. This indigenous development would provide us with ownership of all Data in addition to the overall Control.

It is strongly felt and recommended that efforts invested for in-house development would be better-off considering the dynamic and growing requirements in the time to come.

**Dr. G.M. Desai** (Executive Director PCET) suggested that a similar System is being developed in NMIET, Talegaon which can be reviewed for references.

- Regarding creation of '**Reserve Fund**' it was mentioned that it must be created in the beginning of the Year itself immediately after the Student Fee is received. Amount receivable from Social Welfare Department which is yet to be received can be added later if needed. For now it was suggested to make a provision of Rs. Fifty Lacs at the earliest possible depending upon the availability of Funds.
- Regarding '**Revenue Generation**' it was informed that Revenue of Rs. 25 – 30 Lacs is generated so far and various efforts are proposed. Testing Laboratory facility in the Civil Engineering Department is utilized and a Revenue of Rs. 80, 000/- is generated till now.

All initiatives are appreciated and all are encouraged to invest enhanced efforts towards the same.

- Regarding applying for '**Autonomy**' it was informed that Report is being prepared for submission, Presentations are getting ready, Program Structure and Syllabus for UG Programs is being finalized, for ME Programs and MBA, MCA Structure and Syllabus are being framed. All efforts are in progress as per the predefined timelines.

**4) To Review Expenses of March 2018, April 2018 to August 2018.**

Information was shared regarding the Salary Expenses maintained at 68% for Financial Year 2017 – 18, other Expenses maintained within the Budget which include Furniture, Lab Development and Equipment. It was also informed that new Computers for Computer, IT and MCA Departments are not being purchased in view of the proposal of 'Virtualization' under consideration.

Electricity Expenses are higher due to the construction work of the Architecture Building; which were made through PCCoE. Separate Meter can be installed in due course of time.

Expenses of various Fees paid include increased Approval Fees, Fees for NRI and PIO Admissions, Shikshan Shulka, NAAC etc.

Expenses from April 2018 to August 2018 are including the Salary calculations with 132% DA from July 2018.

It was mentioned that stringent monitoring is exercised to maintain the Expenses within Budgets.

**5) To consider and recommend Revised Budget for Financial Year 2018 – 19.**

Budget was put up considering full Admissions however in view of a few Vacant Seats and cancellations; a decrease of Rs. 65 Lacs in the Fees Receipt has occurred. This is reflected in the Revised Budget. Rest all remains the same.

**6) To take review of the Results of University Examination held in May – June 2018.**

Information was shared regarding Quality Results of all Programs with a special feature that most of the Students have scored First Class i.e. more than 60% or Distinction. Department wise Results were presented.

Information was also shared regarding the eleven Students who have secured **Merit Positions in the SPPU**. In view of our Civil Engineering Program being comparatively new, Special mention of the 4 Students from Civil Engineering was made who have scored Merit Positions in the SPPU. 43 Students from SE have scored more than 80% as a result of focused planned efforts which were invested Subject wise. Maximum Students are in First Class and Distinction.

TE and BE Results are also good and for BE it is 95% and above. For MBA and MCA further improvements are observed and for ME the Result is 90% and above.

An observation was put forth about FE Students that 195 Students have scored above 9 SGPA and PCCoE stands at third position under SPPU.

It was also shared that the intake quality of the Institute Level Admissions hampers the First Year Results and due quality check must be ensured to avoid the same.

As per our exiting Process, additional efforts are invested for these Students by conducting extra Sessions and providing specific inputs.

Congratulations and Best wishes were extended to Students who scored Merit Positions in the SPPU and all other Students who passed with First Class and Distinction. Sincere efforts of all Students and Faculty Members are appreciated.

#### 7) To take review of the **Admissions** for the **Academic Year 2018 – 19**

Admission scenario is very encouraging – for FE 686 Admissions are done (8 seats vacant), Direct Second Year 144 Admissions done (only 2 seats vacant) for genuine reasons like Tuition Fees Waiver Scheme (TFWS). For MBA, MCA and ME 181 Admissions are done (36 seats vacant).

Sincere efforts of the Admission Committees, FE Team, DSE Team and all other Members of 'Team PCCoE' who are directly / indirectly involved are acknowledged and appreciated. Thanks to Dr. G. M. Desai and his Team for the Institute Level Admissions.

Special feature to be mentioned is the increased Cut Off which resulted in further improved Quality Intake.

It was discussed and proposed to apply for 'Increase in Intake' for UG in Computer Engineering, Information Technology (60 Intake) each. And PG in 'Construction Management' in Civil Engineering Department (18 Intake) from Academic Year 2019 – 20.

It was mentioned that after carrying out a diligent feasibility Study and Survey, a detailed Proposal can be put-up for consideration and subsequent approval.

**11) Any other point with permission of the Chairman.**

- Information was shared regarding a **proposed Session on 'Entrepreneurship Development' for PCET Students** on 25<sup>th</sup> Sept 2018 at 09:00 AM in the PCET Auditorium. Dr. S.S. Lakade and Prof. S.A. Rawandale are requested to coordinate.
- **Regarding providing more seats in the College Hostel for Engineering Students of SE, TE and BE** it was mentioned that, Students who cannot receive accommodation in the Hostel due to (Merit based) allocation constraints are forced to stay outside the Campus.

All this results in more time spent in transportation and deviation of focus from the Academics. Students who stayed in College Hostel have good Results in FE however when they are staying outside, the Results tend to decrease from SE onwards.

In case if we can provide more seats and encourage Students to stay in the College Hostel, they would be able to get associated with many activities in all four Domains achieving overall benefits and development.

This was discussed and it was mentioned that feasibility would be checked for reallocation of

seats and / or making additional Hostel provision in the time to come.

- Prof. S.K. Bhoite put forth a **suggestion regarding development of the Workshop** with a view of investing enhanced efforts towards 'Project Based Learning' for overall development of the Students. These efforts would eventually result in Revenue Generation' in the times to come. It was suggested that the feasibility for making a separate provision for the same in the Budget; should be explored.
- A request was put up once again for **providing concession in Fees (based on Merit) for Children of the College Employees**. It was suggested to put up a Proposal accordingly.
- Similarly a mention regarding **provision of Medical Policy for Staff Members** was made once again. This was reviewed earlier however no cost effective solution could be identified.
- Information was shared regarding suggestions received during the visit of UGC Experts Committee for 'Swachhata Ranking 2018' which included adopting eco-friendly ways of working, introduction of wormy compost Plant and other related avenues.


